Analysis

In the survey all the samples have taken online classes. The entire study based on the need for effective digital communication skills becomes relevant since teaching through online mediums has become the need of an hour.



The samples were asked if they use type of tools or innovative learning processes while teaching online. Most of the samples answered that they use online platforms like Zoom, Google Meet, etc. But other than this, interestingly, teachers have also used tools like Padlet, Mentimeter & Visual Labs; tools which make the session interactive and you get direct answers from the students. Teachers have also tried to use audio-visual lectures which might make the student want to watch it like any other video and make the teaching effective. Teachers

have also continuously kept tabs on the progress of the student by conducting daily online activities or a Google form test.



In spite of all the above mentioned tools and techniques, there are a lot of difficulties and challenges faced by the teachers on a daily basis while teaching online. Out of the 23 responses 13 percent of the samples mentioned students to be non-responsive while attending the lectures, 39.1% face technical issues like network problems, power-cuts, etc. while teaching and 47.8% answered that the students have a low attention span while attending online lectures which makes digital communication an integral part of teaching methodology.







The samples were also asked to choose among the above options as to what constitutes under digital communication skills according to them. Incidentally, 26.1% believe that technical skills are a big part of digital communication while 65.2% believe that not only technical skills but digital communication is a mixture of positive motivation, effective body language, sense of humor and team formation. But still only 17.4% believed that these skills are enough to keep a student engaged in online lectures while 43.5% answered a "maybe" in the question.

In actuality, there are two types of digital skills which need to be mastered digital hard skills and digital soft skills. Hard skills include the know-how of the various digital platforms across internet and World Wide Web and building your digital self-confidence. But teachers need to effectively work on digital soft skills which are more complex and less tangible where there is a need to communicate confidently, clearly and successfully through various online platforms.

The samples were also asked if they have attended any workshops or refresher courses to enhance their online teaching skills to which 15 responded in yes and rest in no. Here, it is clear that a proper training programme or faculty development programmes are a necessity to enhance the digital soft skills of a teacher rather than technical skills as to understand how to engage a student positively in an online lecture.

The respondents were also asked to give an idea of theirs as to how they can make online mode of teaching effective to which many interesting responses were captured. Many samples believed in healthy discussion groups, interactive sessions and activities connect emotionally to a student to encourage him or her for active participation in the discussion. Many answered that effective team-building activities and exercises are a key to making the lecture engaging. Collaborative space for student will bring out a sense of initiation automatically is what the samples said. Also, content should be presented in different styles, effectively making full usage of multimedia technology which might make the lectures engaging and interesting.

Lastly, the samples were asked why there is a need for effective digital communication. Following were some of the responses:

- 3. It enables the creation of platforms and environments where communication participants can share ideas collaborate and engage in joint action with likeminded peers.
- 4. The two-way and real-time nature of digital allows communication participants to engage in ways that meet their needs and desires, at a convenient time and place.
- 5. The pandemic was a surprise, and there could be such surprises anytime. Digital is the new today; we have to have effective digital communication skills to survive as trainers.
- 6. As per the pandemic situation it's a need for today's world, no doubt Digital platform will be the mainstream in coming future.

- 8. Because not everyone is technologically advanced to use the tools available for the smooth functioning of classes and sessions.

Therefore, there is a need to adapt to the new change and become digitally self-sufficient and adopt different digital hard skills and soft skills.
